Will Planning Guide

Mission of the Catholic Education Foundation

The Catholic Education Foundation is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit charitable corporation dedicated to the advancement of Catholic education in the Diocese of Joliet. The Foundation's mission is to provide long-term financial support to diocesan Catholic schools, and to Catholic educational programs of diocesan parishes and organizations.

To meet this goal, the Foundation educates the general public of numerous tax advantaged gift vehicles, and works with the donor to determine an effective and appropriate plan to match their specific charitable intent. The seven counties of the Diocese of Joliet are blessed to have forty eight elementary schools and seven high schools, each striving to bring the word of God to children in a Catholic faith-based environment.

The Foundation directly distributes hundreds of need-based scholarships and educational program grants each year.

The Foundation is managed by a Board of Directors which includes both clergy and lay leaders from the diocese.

The Catholic Education Foundation of the Diocese of Joliet has provided this publication as a service to its people.

Wording for Specific Bequests A)

Request for General Purposes

Donors who elect to bequeath assets for the benefit of educational programs in the parishes or the schools of the Diocese of Joliet are encouraged to use the Catholic Education Foundation to ensure that their charitable intentions are satisfied in perpetuity and in accordance with their wishes. The following examples provide the suggested wording for such a bequest to the Catholic Education Foundation of the Diocese of Joliet.

An example of a simple will might read as follows:

I, John Doe, conscious of the fact that all that I have God has given me, desire to dispose of my worldly gifts in an orderly fashion.

I direct that 5% of my estate be given to The Catholic Education Foundation of the Diocese of Joliet, Illinois to be used to continue the good works of the Roman Catholic Church.

Likewise I direct that 5% of my estate be given to my home Parish, St. Boniface, to be used according to the needs of the parish as determined by its Pastor. These gifts together represent 10% of my worldly possessions, and fulfill my obligations to the concept of Christian Stewardship as set forth in the Scriptures.

For the love and care that my friend, Jane Dowling, has shown to me in my lifetime, I direct that 10% of my estate be given to her.

The balance of my estate shall be shared equally between my son, James Edward Doe, and my daughter Elizabeth Doe Jones.

At this point the person executing the will should be sure to sign and date the will, and place it in safe-keeping with other important papers.

Making a Will is a gesture that says you want to take care of the people, causes, and things that you were attached to during your lifetime. Only through making a legal will can you assure that your wishes will be followed.

This simple form will help you to gather important information, but will also help you to think about who and what it is that you truly hold dear.
